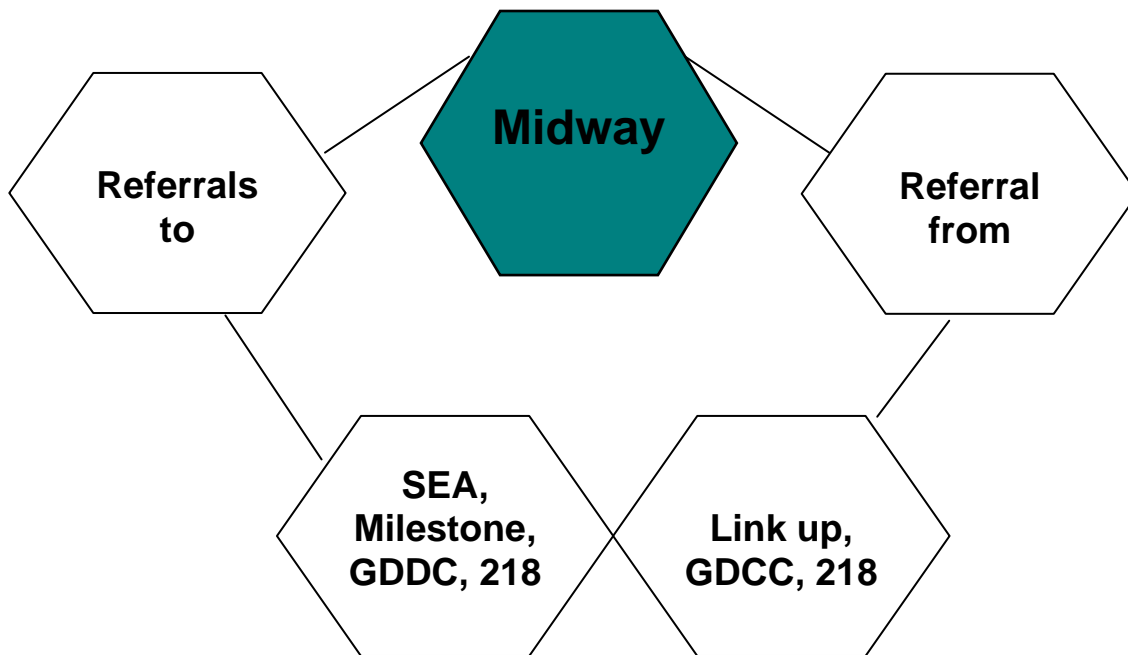


# Internal Referral information

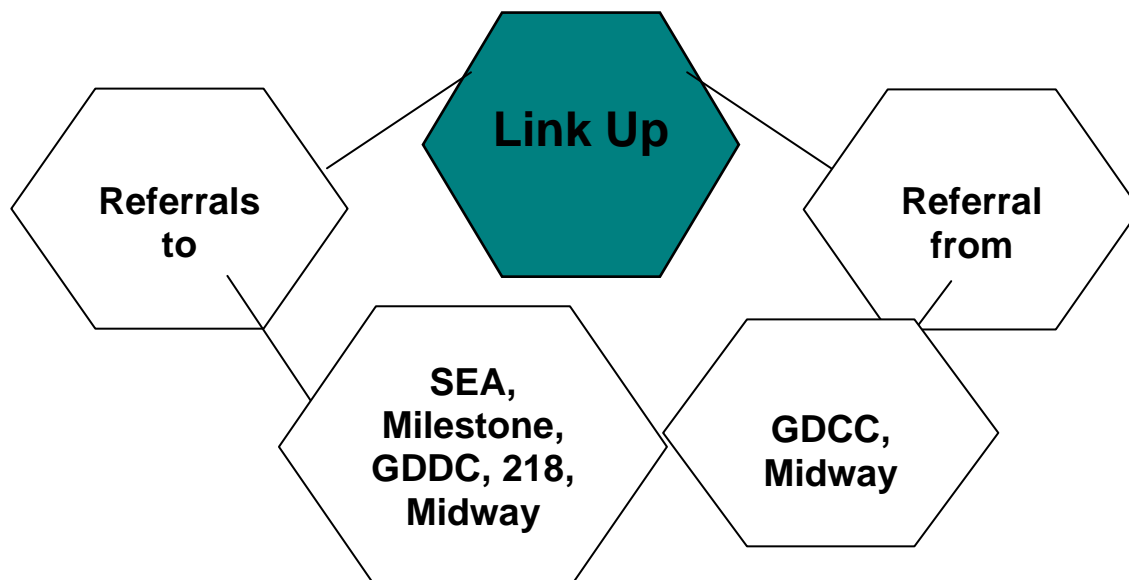

**Link-Up** is a crisis service for individuals who are rough sleeping and or homeless who experience issues with addiction, primarily alcohol. Within Link Up there is **One Stop:** provides a 24 hours assessment and advice centre. The centre is open 365 days of the year. Individuals are able to self refer

Individuals can attend for advice and access to other services, for example, Homeless Addiction Team (HAT), Glasgow Council for Alcohol (GCA), Social Work department,

**Crisis Residential Unit:** This provides a safe and secure environment enabling the individual to withdraw from a chaotic lifestyle. The unit comprises of a 12 bedded unit, in which the current average stay is approximately 28-36 days. **Long Stay Unit:** The focus of the Long Stay Unit is on resettlement. The service provides accommodation for six residents for a period of six to nine months. Service users are supported to develop their independent living skills and further address their identified areas of need.

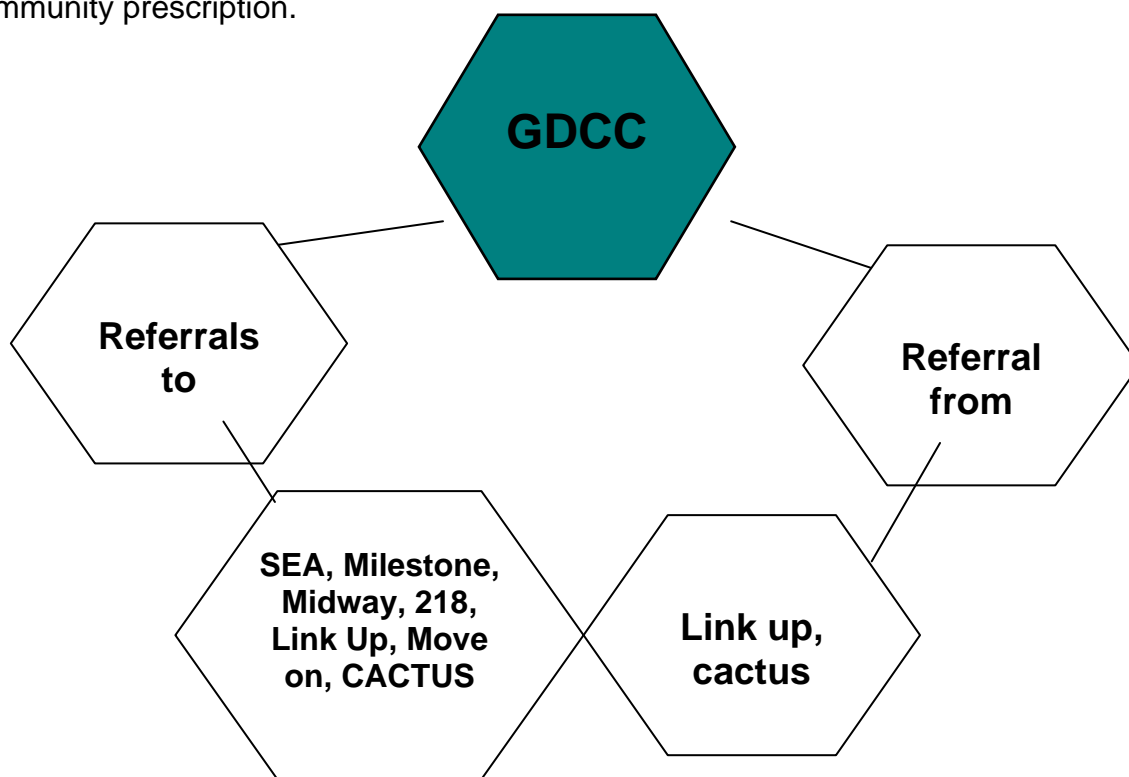

Situated in the heart of Glasgow, **the Glasgow Drugs Crisis Centre (GDCC)** offers short term crisis intervention for people with substance misuse, the centre is opened 24hrs a day 356 days a year. **The One stop service:** will provide information on a range of issues including legal services, health, housing and harm reduction. **Needle exchange:** Used injecting equipment can be disposed of safely and exchanged for new ones. We can also put you in touch with other agencies in the city. **Residential unit:** Admission to the unit will be considered if service users are no longer coping in the community and require greater input that can be provided by community based services. **Methadone Dispensing clinic:** for service users who have left the residential unit. In specific circumstances the clinic will offer a dispensing service for SU, who have difficulty in gaining access to a community prescription.

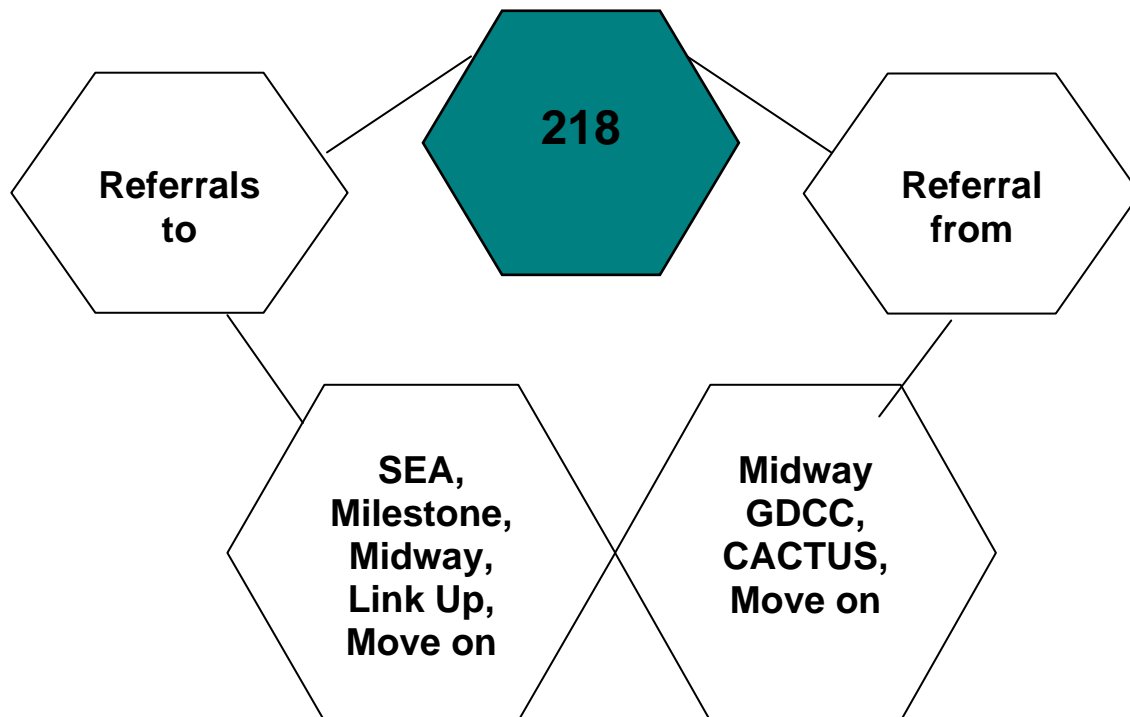

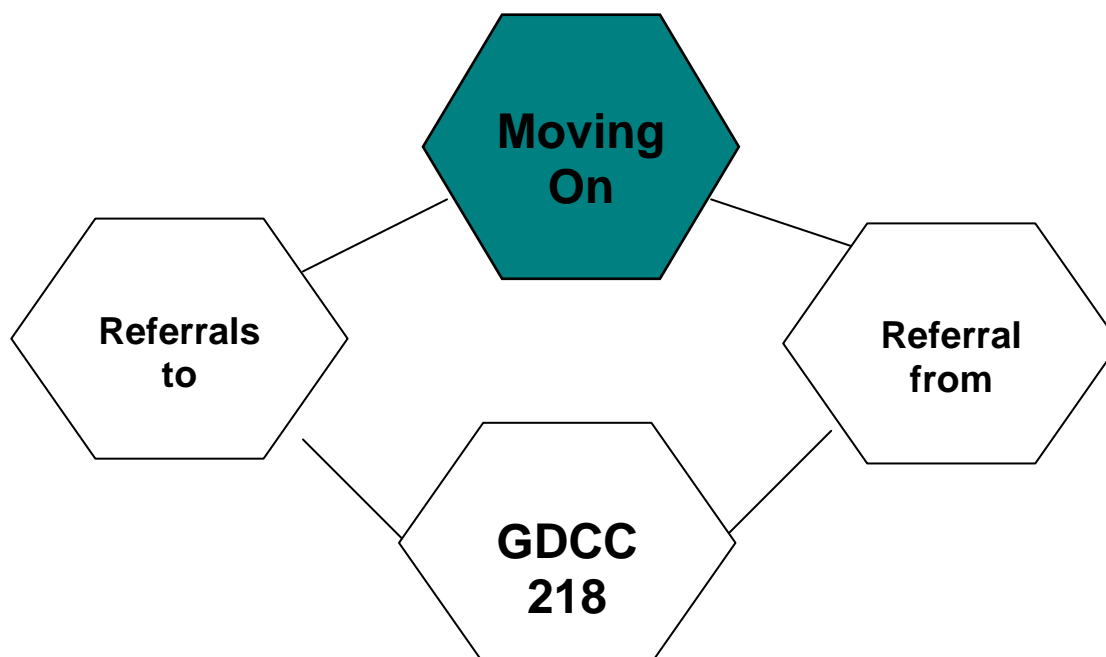

**Moving On** are housing support service which provides a temporary measure of safe and comfortable accommodation for individuals, who are homeless and are seeking to resolve their drug misuse issues.

Moving On is designed for individuals who are over 18 years of age, who are homeless or in temporary accommodation. The individual will be striving to gain independent living, but at present requires housing support. They will have a history of drug related issues with a period of stability and be motivated to continue to address these.

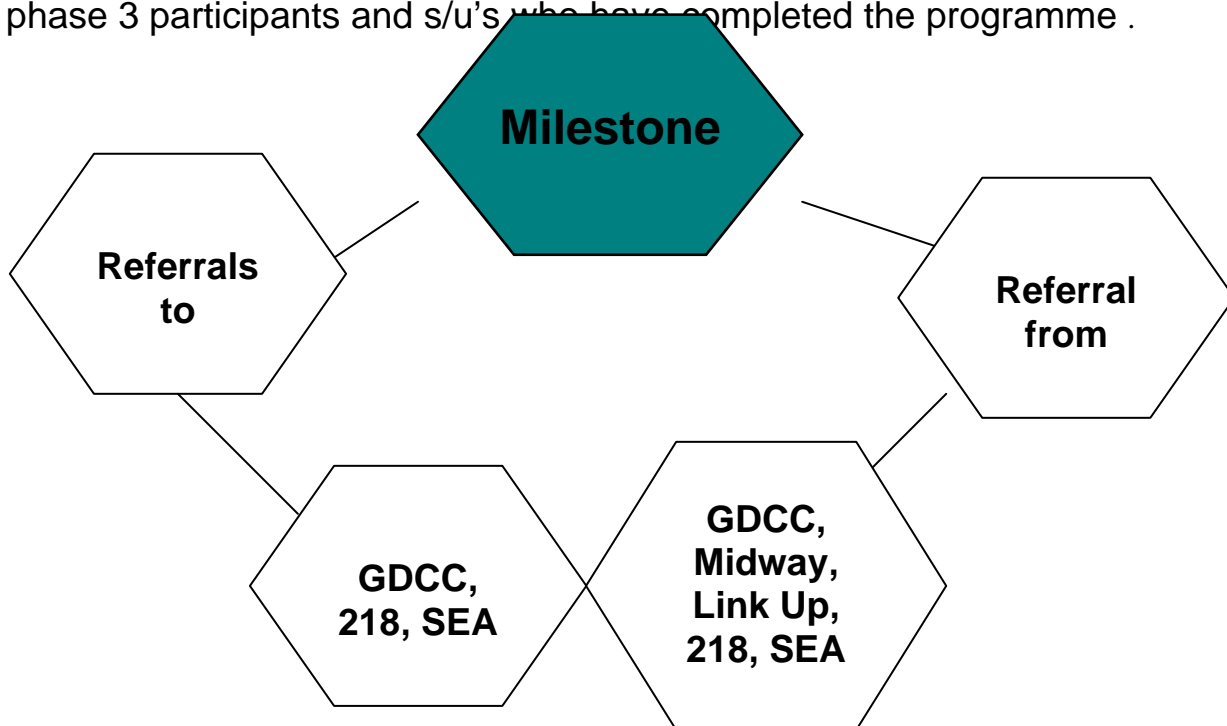

**The Milestone service** provides individual person centred support to stable drug misusers, former misusers and their families. Milestone also works with those with alcohol related issues. Milestone provides day services for people living in Glasgow East area which include Bridgton, Parkhead, Tollcross, Shettleston, Dennistoun, Dalmarnock, Garthamlock, and Townhead. The service currently offers a range of group and one to one sessions in 3 phases that promotes harm reduction and or abstinence. Plus an aftercare service for phase 3 participants and s/u's who have completed the programme .

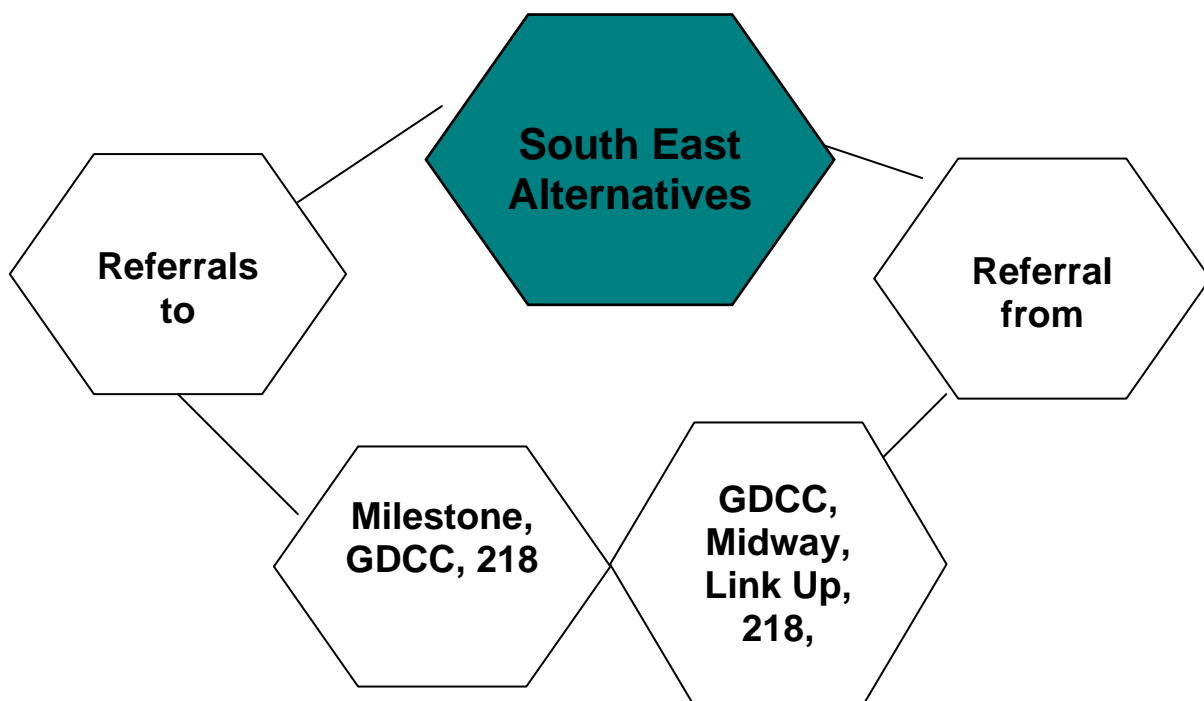

Are already stable on prescription or abstinent, have successfully reduced substance misuse for the last month and experienced a couple of days abstinence or stability. Willing and able to work honestly in 121 and groups to change behavior. Willing to promote the safety of SEA programmes by preventing substance misuse in and around the project

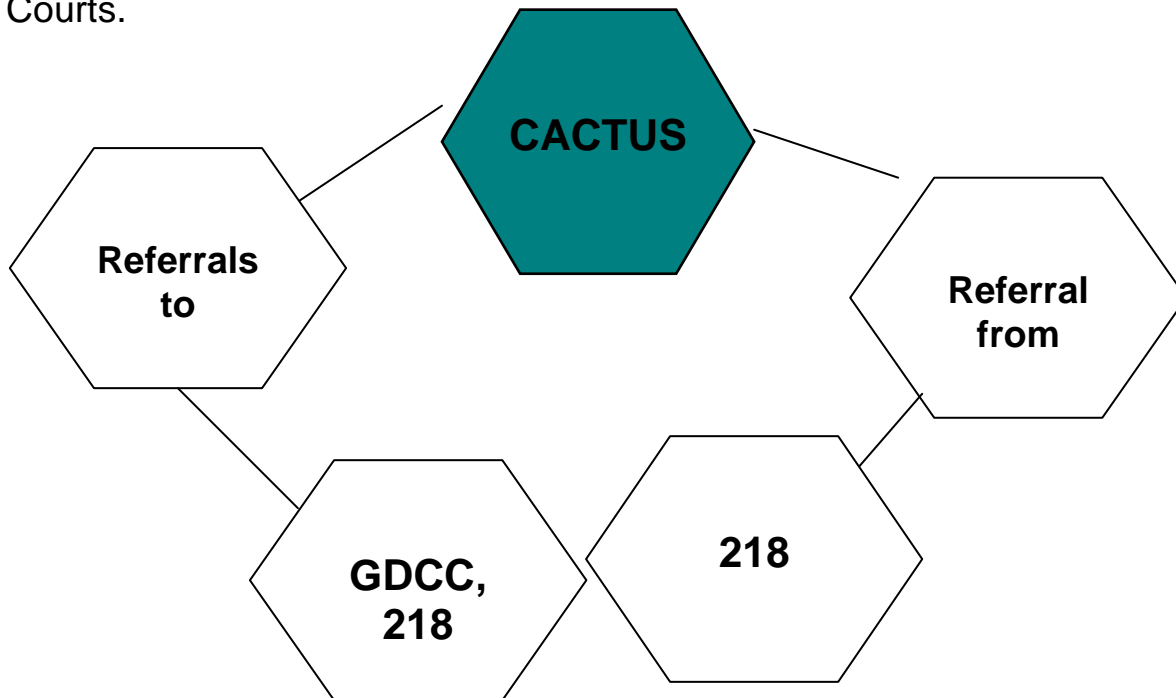
